Royal Arch Masons a little History Lesson...

In the original Hebrew the Ark of the Covenant has three different main names:

1: "Aron Ha-Brit" (ארון הברית) – literally means 'the Ark of the Covenant.' This is the most popular Hebrew name for the Ark and can be found in the Hebrew Bible mainly in the Book of Deuteronomy and the Book of Joshua.

"And Joshua said to the priests, "Take up the ark of the covenant and pass on before the people." So they took up the ark of the covenant and went before the people." (Joshua 3:6)

2: "Aron Ha-Edut" {ארון העדות} – literally means 'the Ark of the Testimony' and can be found in the Book of Exodus in general and in our weekly Torah portion in particular.

"There I will meet with you, and from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim that are on the ark of the testimony..." (Exodus 25:22)

3: "Aron Ha-Elohim" {ארון האלוהים} – literally means 'the Ark of God' and can be found in the Book of Samuel (1 and 2) and in the Book of Chronicles (1 and 2).

"And David arose and went with all the people who were with him from Baale-judah to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of the LORD of hosts who sits enthroned on the cherubim." (2 Samuel 6:2)

Dear Brother:

I congratulate you upon being raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. Masonry, as you know, is so full of teachings and symbolism, it is impossible to receive and understand it all. Most of it is not found in the catechism which you have learned. I urge you to attend Lodge and witness every degree as often as you can. Each time you will pick up something "new", something which has a new meaning or symbolism which has not been noticed by you before. Teachings and knowledge is light. A wise man will always have a quest for light as you did when you were an Entered Apprentice, then more light as a Fellow Craft, then further light still as a Master Mason. But, is this all the light you can receive?

In your third degree, one says, "Behold, the Temple is not yet completed" and later one says "the Masters' Word is Lost". This was to inform you that there must be further light. And it is my duty to inform you, there must be further light! And it is my duty to inform you, there is!

Over two centuries ago, most of our Brethren were known as "Ancient York Masons". When the two Grand Lodges of England united in 1813, a firm and solemn landmark was adopted and placed in the Articles of Union to guide all Masons throughout the world, forever on the matter: "Ancient Freemasonry consists of but three degrees, is., that of Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, and Master Mason including the Supreme Order of the Holy Royal Arch."

At that time, only Past Masters of Blue "Symbolic" Lodges were qualified to receive the Royal Arch degree. It was then deemed that this degree was so important that Master Masons who having received the Mark Master Degree, were able to become (Virtual or Honorary) Past Master, thus making them eligible to witness the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple, and the Royal Arch Degree, where they were permitted to find and receive the 'Long Lost Masters' Word'! These degrees were taken from the Blue Lodges, and set up under a separate body known as Chapters. Royal Arch Chapters confer the Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master and Royal Arch Degrees.

Symbolic Lodges, Royal Arch Chapters, together with Council of Royal and Select Masons and Commanderies of Knights Templar, compose the York Rite.

The Royal Mater and Select Master Degrees in the Council are two of the most beautiful degrees in Masonry and show why the "WORD" and why, where and how it was preserved for discovery.

The Knights Templar is sometimes referred to as the 'Christian Body of Masonry', however members of all Religions can and are Knighted within the Commandery. The three Order of Templary are the Order of the Red Cross, the Order of Malta and the Order of the Temple. These Degrees, Orders as they are called, are beautiful and most impressive and use the 'New Testament' for the Christian inclusion into Freemasonry. "Every Christian Mason should be a Knight Templar".

The most beautiful, impressive, educational and enlightening degrees in Masonry are found in the York Rite. All Master Masons should consider expanding their knowledge and understanding and therefore joining their local York Rite organization. You only need to fill out a petition, submit it and then you will begin your continued journey, one which you will never regret undertaking.

After you feel comfortable within the Lodge we hope that we will be hearing from you, in the very near future, and begin your journey to hailing you not only as Friend and Brother but also as Companion and Sir Knight.

By assignment of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of Royal Arch Masons, with the gracious permission of the Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Michigan, the Grand Chapter has launched a program called "The Masonic Heritage Medal". This award is known as the Lewis award in other jurisdictions. The Son will receive a medal and the father a pin to wear on their jacket.

Ancient lodges perpetuated the symbolism of "Lewis" by recognizing the significance of a Mason's son following the Masonic Direction of his father, thus becoming a "Lewis" Mason.

We have replaced that designation with our own recognition which we have chosen to call the Masonic Heritage Medal, assigning the same prestigious symbolism to our recipients as sons of Masons in early times.

This award is free of charge and will be presented by a current or Past Grand Officer of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Michigan.

Membership recruitment and retention....the double "R".... it seems to be primary on most of our minds and the mantra of the day, and understandably so. But so too is the issue of how we use (or abuse) our ritual. Our ritual is not meant to be read only, but to become in a very real sense an integral part of our minds and hearts. Thus, it permeates and becomes part of our entire being. Hence, the real reason for memorization; for it to be always present and with us throughout our daily challenges and to be able to recall in an instant that valuable lesson in that one piece of ritual which helps us sustain at any given moment or impending challenge in life where our treasured Masonic values come into play.

Keeping this thought in mind, I offer as our educational submission for this month the following article entitled "The 3 Reasons for Memorizing our Ritual", written and authored by WM Flynn Francisco of Lodge #771, somewhere in Mumbai, the capital city of the Indian State of Maharashtra. Pay particular attention to reason #3... "Memorizing ritual is one of the most talked about topics in Masonry today, besides de-recognition and homosexuality, which is still an issue that dates back to the beginning of the Masonic Fraternity. It is a constant struggle between senior brethren and newer members, and a point of soreness should a brother be promoted lacking it. It is also quite possibly one of the simplest expectations of a Mason. I'm of course talking about knowing your ritual. Ritual is an inherent and integral part of Masonry, and although it can be daunting, it is necessary to truly move forward on your Masonic journey. There are of course many reasons why brethren do not do it, i.e. they do not have time, they do not have the mental capacity, they are simply not interested, etc. But learning your ritual is the crux of your entire masonic journey, from understanding Masonry's symbolism to forming your own moral code. Here are 3 reasons you need to memorize your ritual.

1. IT HAS EVERYTHING YOU NEED...

Your ritual forms the basic explanation of what it means to be a Mason, and how to become a better person. One of the most widely known taglines for masonry is that we "Make good men better," and it is not for naught. The ritual contains symbols and metaphors for becoming a better person and living life on the square. It sets a standard of measure for you to continually challenge yourself. It explains why we are a fraternity and why that benefits us. The ritual is your one source of answers for being the best Mason you can be, and being the best person you can be. All you need to do is to read it.

2. IT GIVES YOU DISCIPLINE AND INTELLIGENCE...

The process of memorizing the ritual is in itself is a lesson in discipline and by going through your ritual daily, you are also stimulating your mind, improving both your cognition and memory. The benefits of memorization are well recorded and a quick google search will let you know exactly how beneficial it is for your brain.

3. IT'S NOT FOR YOU...

At the end of the day though, you are not memorizing the ritual for yourself. You are memorizing it so that you may pass on that knowledge to the next generation of Masons. Masonry is as much about the future as it is about the past, and memorizing your ritual is a key step in passing on the light. Whether you are in the master's chair carrying out the third degree, or being called upon for help by a fellow brother, the ritual is a guide for you to live your life and a guide to impart advice and instruction to those that follow in your footsteps."
