IT'S PICNIC TIME!!!

Did you know the bacteria that cause food poisoning multiply quickest in the "Danger Zone" between 40 and 140 degrees Fahrenheit?

Use a food thermometer. Cooked food is safe only after it's been heated to a high enough temperature to kill harmful bacteria. Color and texture alone won't tell you whether your food is done. The possibility of bacterial growth actually increases as food cools after cooking because the drop in temperature allows bacteria to thrive. But you can keep your food above the safe temperature of 140 degrees Fahrenheit by using a heat source like a chafing dish, warming tray, or slow cooker.

Stay Clean by washing hands and surfaces often. Why it matters you ask? Illness-causing bacteria can survive in many places around your kitchen, including your hands, utensils, and cutting boards.

Unless you wash your hands, utensils and surfaces the **right** way, you could spread bacteria to your food, yourself and others. Wash hands for 20 seconds, with soap and running water. It can stop the spread of Bacteria along with washing surfaces and utensils after each use.

Wash fruit and vegetables. Even if you plan to peel fruits and veggies, it's important to wash them first because bacteria can spread from the outside to the inside as you cut or peel them.

Refrigerate food promptly. Why this matters you ask? Illness-causing bacteria can grow in perishable foods within 2 hours unless you refrigerate them? (And if 90 degrees F or higher, cut that time in half!)

Cold temperatures slow the growth of illness-causing bacteria. It's important to chill food promptly and properly. You can also freeze almost any food.

Never thaw or marinate foods on the counter. Many people are surprised at this. but since bacteria can multiply rapidly at room temperature, thawing or marinating foods on the counter is one of the riskiest things you can do when preparing food.

Remember the saying, "When in doubt, throw it out"!

Have a great summer and follow these tips at home and at your next family picnic or cook out.

Set Your Sights on Excellence, Not Perfection

The year is coming full circle and before we know it our Annual Grand York Rite Session will be upon us. I want to take a moment to thank the Companions who have welcomed me into their Councils. There are Councils struggling with membership and activity, but the light shines brightly in the hearts and souls of the members of the Cryptic Rite. You have made me feel welcome and reassured my faith in the strength of our membership. With our membership in need of more members, I am pleased to find the internal qualities of Council members as strong and vibrant as ever. Visiting with you makes my travels easier and makes the long hours on the road worth it. The friendships make it a joy.

This month I want to share an excellent observation with you, and it came from Excellent Companion Jack Ruby, High Priest of Monroe Chapter No. 1. After the Council meeting, it was my pleasure to join the Companions for the Chapter meeting where the High Priest said, regarding the work of the Chapter, "We are looking for excellence rather than perfection." That really struck a chord with me because we set ourselves up for disappointment and self-criticism by setting goals that require 'perfection' so anything less is a failure.

"Did they use books?" "Was it letter perfect?" "He left that out." "They didn't do that." We put ourselves in the position that anything less than perfection is the failure to some degree. But 'excellence' on the other hand is an entirely different animal. It allows us to succeed in increments, it makes everything a potential success! You may not be able to memorize an opening part perfectly but you may be able to read it excellently. This is a difference that makes a difference. Do what you can do with excellence; don't judge yourself by an arbitrary standard of 'perfection' that is impossible to attain.

I spent hundreds of hours teaching flight students how to fly on instruments. It is extremely challenging to obtain an Instrument Pilot Rating and that is compounded by the stories and legends of pilots that flew perfectly and "painted the needles" when they flew. That means they flew so well and 'on course' that the instruments showed them to be right on course without deviation. Students would beat themselves up over not being able to duplicate this high standard. For them, the needles only passed through the center of the dial when they were headed to the other side of the dial!

The parallel here is that no one ever really "paints the needles," they just correct before anyone happens to notice. Perfection leaves you with only one way to go, namely somewhere less perfect. Excellence, on the other hand, is the ability to correct toward the perfect. The pilot's goal is to increase his proficiency in correcting back to the center. For the Mason it is in each stone we square that the Temple comes to completion. As we grow and practice our excellence we grow more able to respond. A Council member can achieve a measure of excellence by reading their part well and continue the work of excellence by increasing their capabilities as time allows.

Ever upwards and onwards, Companions! Strive for excellence, not perfection.

Why do Dogs tilt their heads?

Researchers believe that dogs tilt their heads for several reasons, such as detecting vocal cues and body language.

You may think your pup is just so doggone cute when he tilts his head to one side, hanging on your every word, but is he listening intently, or is it something else? Animal behavior experts say that dogs are good at responding to body language and vocal cues, and that it's possible that they are listening for specific words or inflections -- especially those that could lead to fun outdoor activities or food. The head tilt may also be connected to how a dog's ear is constructed, and by angling his head, a dog may be trying to pick up on useful sensory information. Stanley Cohen, a noted psychologist known for his best-selling books on the mental abilities of dogs, says that the head tilt may also be related to sight. Depending on its size, a dog's muzzle may block his view of his owner's facial expressions, and by tilting his head, he's trying to get a better view.
