The future of Royal Arch Masonry relies on its membership, retention and education of that membership. I believe that communication, visibility, and education are the best tools we have to obtain these goals.

Being visible can be accomplished in several ways. We should strive to attend our local Chapters on a regular basis. By doing this we will be better informed of activities, events, and ritual. We should make it a point to be active within our Lodges. This is where we get our prospective new members. Talk to the Master about doing a red coat degree, Enhance the Secret program, or offer a lodge appreciation night as one of your Chapter functions. When attending a tiled or public masonic function, be sure to wear your chapter coat. It will spark interest and give you an opportunity to talk about Chapter and what if offers.

Education is a never-ending process. By regular attendance in our Chapter meetings, taking part in our schools and inspections, a companion is sure to pick up knowledge he did not previously have. I have attended several schools this year and attendance has been dismal at best. We also need to encourage attendance at the Grand Chapter Session; the Grand Chapter has new and revised programs to help in the areas of recruitment, communication and education.

Communication is key to both being visible and education. The options are many - phone, mail, email, texting, websites, social media, and automated voice calls. How else can you communicate with your members? Communication works for those who work at it!

Membership Retention and Restoration

- 1. Chapter Fellowship
 - a. Have a dinner or dessert before or after your meetings
 - b. Monthly breakfast or dinner (also a great fundraiser)
- c. Visit other Chapters or Blue lodges (it's where the new members are)
- d. Participate in community events, such as, fundraisers, volunteer activities, etc.
- 2. Capitulary Education
- a. Every Chapter should have an Education Officer. The Education Officer should share any new and/or useful information at each stated meeting as part of the proceedings.
 - b. Hold Degree practice at least once a month
- c. Make sure each officer has an Officer's manual to reference what is expected for the position he holds.
- d. Take time to study the degrees individually to understand and learn the meanings behind that degree. The better one understands the degree, the better mentor one will be for new members.

3. Membership

- a. Establish a Membership committee. The committee should consist of 4-5 members.
- b. Establish a relationship with a Blue lodge. Become "that person" Blue lodge members go to for information.
- c. Create social networking accounts, such as, Facebook, Twitter, Website, etc. Make sure to use the sites and keep content current.
- d. Get Active. Chapters will NOT keep or gain members if all we do is a business meeting. New members want some kind of purpose of membership.
- e. Host a dinner that includes nonmembers, their ladies, family and friends (see also fellowship)

4. Communication

- a. Know your audience
- b. Use email, newsletters, regular mailings, and phone calls for Chapter events.
- c. Use Facebook, Twitter, etc. Use a Website. Keep it simple and current.
 - d. Texting is popular among younger members.
- e. Include other Chapters and lodges in your area of your events. It's a way to build relationships and network.

5. Future Planning

- a. Chapters should have a Planning committee. Include officers of the moving line, excluding the HP.
 - b. If you have no plan, then you are planning to fail.
 - c. The plan should consist of one year to five year goals.
 - d. Track your goals and modify your plan as needed.

"GREETINGS FROM THE GRAND EAST"



Have We Become Prisoners of "Preservation"

An acronym is an abbreviation formed from the initial components in a phrase or a word. Usually these components are individual letters, for example NATO—the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. We use acronyms



as tools to reinforce what we perceive as essential characteristics. For example, in the workplace –the 5 Ps (Prior Planning Promotes Perfect Performance are essential characteristic of an organization. You may have seen the 4 P's espoused in Cryptic marketing publications—<u>Passion, Performance, Perfection, and "Preservation".</u> In fact the word preservation appears more times on the General Grand web site than in our own ritual! Go ahead check it out. Only page 58, paragraph 8, and page 61, continuation of paragraph 3 does the word preserve/preservation appear. Note well, the context in which it used.

The definition of preservation is to keep (something) in its original state or in good condition. The National Trust for Historic Preservation is focused on saving America's historic places. Is our definition of "preservation" to "preserve" archaic usage? For example, the archaic word "suffer" appears on pages 47, 48, 51, and 52 of the Manual for Cryptic Masons (third edition 2010)?

Have we become prisoners of preservation by "bundling" the words "passion", "performance", "perfection" and "preservation" to mean that all manuals, the Council Manual of the Complied Laws of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masons are to be kept "in its original state"? Should not manuals be organic documents? The penalty for being a "Prisoner of Preservation" can be illustrated by the Encyclopedia Britannica. After 244 years selling print editions of the Encyclopedia Britannica, the company stopped selling them in 2012.

Have the words "performance", "perfection" and "preservation" become "bundled" to connote meanings never intended? The Manual for Cryptic Masons (third edition 2010), page 49 admonishes us to "hold in due veneration the ancient landmarks". Regrettably, some companions have lost their way and forgot the admonition and lesson on page 18, line number 40 of our ritual. Many of the so called "landmarks" that occur in the longer lists are actually regulations, customs, or principles which are either of recent origin or unessential to being a Royal and Select Mason. The landmarks are (1) a belief in God; (2) the Bible is an indispensable part of our lives and opens at every assembly. (3) a Royal and Select Mason believes in the immortality of the soul.

Let us move beyond "preservation". Our Masonic membership in Michigan has declined from 45,780 in 2005 to 31,801 in 2015, a decline of 30.5% in a decade. While we all have passion, we need to find "verbs" to replace nouns "performance", "perfection", and "preservation". We must be meaningful, relevant, and rewarding. We must exhibit the qualities of respect, responsibility, trustworthiness, and compassion and stop being prisoners to preservation.
