

Greetings Companions!

I thank you for the privilege of serving you and this Grand Council of Royal and Select Masons of Michigan as its Most Illustrious Grand Master. I have always seen the various Masonic offices as "mini-degrees" that have their own entrances, tokens, and passes and whose Wardens and Gatekeepers must be worthily met in order to move on to the next station. I will have passed successfully through this "degree" if I worthily meet the challenges met in my circumambulations this year! I pledge to you I will do all that is within my power to increase the health and stature of Cryptic Masonry.

My theme is "Live the Secret" because only by living the secret can we be sure that future generations will discover the right. What is buried may never be found, what is not buried may be lost, but what we live, we keep fresh and healthy and pass worthily to future generations.

My symbols, this year, are the sandbox, a reversed broken triangle with the missing piece filled in, and a circle of connected ovals. The sandbox represents the passing nature of all we touch, and reminds us that the grains in a sandbox may stay the same but may form many landscapes, and finally, to remember that our character and our relationships are all we take with us when we depart either the sandbox or this life. The reversed triangle is colored in where the triangle is usually missing a piece. This symbolizes that we must complete the triangle by worthily living the example set by the one whom the broken piece represents. The circle of connected ovals, of course represents the circle of friendship that defines us as Cryptic Masons. These symbols work together to communicate this idea: By improving ourselves from the Imperfect Ashlar to the Perfect Ashlar we complete our Masonic Destiny. Having achieved this, we form a Circle of Perfection with our Companions to build our Masonic Community. The people and programs will change like the sand in the sandbox, but our character and friendships remain.

Companions, each Grand Officer, and the Arch Deputies are here to serve you, to use our skill set(s) to make your Council experience one that is an amazing Masonic Experience. Each Council is a little different; each has a different focus. Real and sustained Masonic revival must come from each individual Mason being excited about his membership experience. That will attract other Masons to Council, and their friends will feel the excitement want to be included.
