> 4 Things You Might Know about Your Cell Phone

.....What were thinking? you Remember hearing that when mom told you don't touch that stove, Its hot, and you did anyhow and burned your fingers. Do you remember seeing a comedy routine where a person passes a park bench and there is a sign "wet paint" and he touches it and it doesn't seem to be wet, so he sits on it and when he gets up, of course, there are stripes across his bottom and his back. What was he thinking?

In our fraternity, we do a lot of ritual work. That ritual work teaches lessons that are valuable for each of us to reflect on for our entire lives. These are serious lessons, yet we tend to slide through, without serious thought, perhaps reading and arguably not reading very well, the ritual. We sit down after the degree, happy to have it over and satisfied with our performance. The candidate sits down after the degree, we ask him what he thought and he gives his appreciation for everyone showing up to confer the degree, and he never shows up again for chapter after that. What were we thinking?

What is the reward of doing quality ritual work? First there is the proud satisfaction having done an excellent job. Second, we have the knowledge of interpreting the lessons and delivering them to the candidate with clarity, understanding and passion. Hopefully, this will encourage the candidate to return and participate.

Indeed, we are frequently encouraged to "think outside the box", but in this instance it might be well to consider resizing the box we are in. What are you thinking?

For all the folks with cell phones. (This should be printed and kept in your car, purse, and wallet. Good information to hve with you.) There are a few things that can be done in times of grave emergencies. Your mobile phone can actually be a life saver or an emergency tool for survival. Check out the things that you can do with it.

FIRST (Emergency)

The Emergency Number worldwide for Mobile is 112. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an Emergency, dial 112 and the mobile will search any existing network to establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly, this number, 112, can be dialed even if the keypad is locked. Try it out.

SECOND (Hidden Battery Power)

Imagine your cell battery is very low. To activate, press the keys *3370#. Your cell phone will restart with this reserve and the instrument will show a 50% increase in battery. This reserve will get charged when you charge your cell phone next time.

THIRD (How to disable a STOLEN mobile phone)

To check your Mobile phone's serial number, key in the following Digits on your phone: ***#06#**. A 15-digit code will appear on the screen. This number is unique to you handset. Write it down and keep it somewhere safe. If your phone is stolen, you can phone your service provide and give them this code. They will then be able to block you handset so even if the thief changes the SIM card, you phone will be totally useless. You probably won't get your

phone back, but at least you know that whoever stole it can't use/sell it either. If everybody does this, there would be no point in people stealing mobile phones.

And Finally... **FOURTH (Free Directory Service** for Cells)

Cell phone companies are charging us \$1.00 to \$1.75 or more for 411 information calls when they don't have to. Most of us do not carry a telephone directory in our vehicle, which makes this situation even more of a problem. When you need to use the 411 information option, simply dial: (800) FREE411 or (800)373-3411 without incurring any charge at all. Program this into your cell phone now. This is sponsored by McDonald's.

Just a small but possibly valuable piece of information that is being passed on to you as a Holiday Gift.

Schools of Instruction & Inspections: Attn-DDIs,



In November's Triple Tau, I closed with the statement..., turn to page 70, the last paragraph, and the last sentence. Just that one sentence is short, on point, and should be emphasized continually and not obscured by faux Elizabethan English which somehow has crept into many of our rituals from DeMolay to SEM even though these rituals were written in the 1920's.

In September 2014, I witnessed Columbian Council No. 1 perform the Super Excellent Master degree. Why is that important? Columbian Council No. 1, as you might surmise, is the "mother council" of all Councils in the world! While the instructional lesson of the Super Excellent Degree is the same, the "dramatization" between Columbian Council No 1 and our Michigan ritual is quite different.

The first thing is the Columbian drama requires a much smaller cast of players. Michigan required 27 members while the Columbian Council required only 5 in the first scene, 2 in the second scene, and a total of 7 in the third and final scene. Look in the Michigan ritual book on page 79 and count the number of characters. The characters in the drama of Columbian Council No. 1 include the players of Zedekiah, Gedaliah, Pashur, and Zephaniah. Although only Zedekiah is called by name, the other councilors are "supporting", never having their own identity beyond being councilors to Zedekiah.

The Jeramiah character who is featured so prominently in Michigan ritual in pages 85 through 88 receives only one mention in the Columbian Council's exemplification. Are there possible explanations why the Jeramiah character takes a leading role in the Michigan dramatization?

There are not 3 officers of the palace, 4 guards, and 4 messengers. Could it be that the Columbian Council's Super Excellent Master degree cast is right "sized" not only for the early 19th but also for the early 21st centuries?

The Super Excellent Master Degree was first conferred in 1817, one hundred ninety seven years ago. While the Columbian Council has done many rewrites over the years, the current version was formalized in 1920. The Michigan ritual for the Super Excellent Master Degree was adopted by the Grand Council of Michigan in 1872, but it was not generally accepted until after 1917.

While both rituals were formalized about the same time, it is striking that Columbian Council No. 1 omitted the words that had fallen out of common use language. Many forms of expression that had become archaic were replaced. An example would be the pronouns, thee, thy, and thou with the now "standard" pronoun "you". Words that caused confusion were also replaced. We need not look further than our own Craft Lodge ritual, specifically replacing "excepted" with "excluded."

Interestingly Columbian Council No 1 does not conclude with the circle of friendship, which is such a powerful experience in our Michigan ritual. To their credit, through Columbian Council's emphasis on instruction and candidate education, the degree strongly inculcates the lessons of faith, fidelity, and friendship.
