Royal Arch Education – Brotherly Love By Comp. Kevin Brown, PHP of Oakland Chapter No. 5

Each individual Royal Arch Mason has his own personal reasons for seaking initiation into Craft Masonry and ultimately joining his local Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. I would encourage all of you, as you enjoy a cup of coffee before or after your Chapter meetings, to ask another Companion the simple question "why did you become a Mason?" Over the years, as I have listened the various answers of Companions I've encountered and one common theme tends to emerge: Brotherly Love. Each Companion describes it in his own way using phrases like friendship, brotherhood, a sense of belonging, or a fraternal bond but Brotherly Love is consistantly an underlying theme.

If you recall back to the lecture you heard after your initiation into Masonry, we are taught that Brotherly Love is one of the tenets of our profession. It was described as regarding the "whole human species as one family, the high and low, the rich and poor" and we are encouraged to "aid, support, and protect one another." 


