

Later that afternoon, we held a Halloween party at the Port Huron Masonic Temple for all Three Youth Groups. A great turnout with some prospective members!



Books can be used; but points will be deducted. Each Grand Officer will rate the degree on a scale of 0-100, for a total possible of 200 points.

Special Ritual Competition Aprons will be awarded to the winning team, that they can wear with honor until the following year's competition.

This is a chance for your Chapter to showcase its talent and passion for Royal Arch Masonry.
