Eminent Commander and Sir Knights:

Now that the East Central Department Conference and Call to Conclave of the Grand Encampment of the United States has come and gone, I'd like to take a moment to inform you of what happened.

The Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Michael Johnson, as predicted, attempted to rule the Special Conclave out of order. He was immediately declared to be "conflicted" as he was the reason why the Special Conclave was called. Past Grand Master, David Dixon Goodwin, was then elected to preside over the Conclave. There were several initial minutes of contention as Grand Master Johnson attempted to declare the Special Conclave closed. However, he was unsuccessful and Past Grand Master Goodwin assumed the East and presided.

Several decisions were then made. Sir Knight David J. Kussman, who had previously been removed by Grand Master Johnson, was elected to be reinstated to his position as Deputy Grand Master. It was then determined to remove Grand Master Johnson. The vote was 219 to remove, 57 to not with 15 abstentions. The delegates then entertained a motion to elect Deputy Grand Master David J. Kussman to the office of Grand Master. The voice vote was resoundingly affirmed. The remaining officers were then elected and are: R.E. Deputy Grand Master-Jeffrey A. Bolstad and R.E. Grand Generalissimo-Jack M. Harper. The office of R.E. Grand Captain General is being filled until the next Triennial by the Grand Commander of California, David W. Studley.

Several decisions by Grand Master Johnson were then reviewed. The following have been rescinded: 1,2,3,4, and Koon Decision of September 1, 2021. General Order No. 1 was declared out of order. Decisions 5 and 6 were affirmed and required no further review (if you require further details of the decisions and General Orders, refer to the Grand Encampment website). After all the "business" of the Special Conclave, the ladies were invited into the room and the officers were installed by Past Grand Master Goodwin. New Grand Master Kussman thanked everyone and asked for healing not only for the Grand Encampment but also for our brother Michael Burke Johnson. While this is a snapshot of the weekend, the most important decisions have been addressed.

A personal observation: There was a tremendous amount of tension during this conference. While it was great to see old friends, make new ones, and engage in conversations, there was quite a bit of "what ifs" swirling about. I personally engaged in several conversations with the officers of Michigan but also from

our sister jurisdictions and Grand Encampment officers. Many of these "what if's," depending on the outcome, were fraught with danger and certainly destructive to the Grand Encampment and our Grand Commanderies as we currently know them. However, everyone agreed, we were prepared to do what was needed to make sure that Knights Templar throughout the land would prevail.

After the decisions, election, and installation, one could visually see the relief in the room. Smiles returned to the Grand Encampment officers, hugs and handshakes were plentiful and hope for a better tomorrow had returned. The delegates made the correct decisions for the organization and order was restored.

I wish to thank all who attended from Michigan. All the line officers were present. Several appointed officers and many Past Grand Commanders and their ladies were as well. As delegates, they had the responsibility to represent you. Sir Knights, you should be proud of these officers and Past Grands for taking the time to be present and for voting their conscience on your behalf. Because of these and the collective Sir Knights from throughout the realm, our values as Freemasons and Christian Knights prevailed.

While this has been a dark chapter in the history of the Grand Encampment, I am uplifted by you Sir Knights. In my travels around the state and to your Commanderies, when entering upon the discussion of the Call to Conclave, you never once turned your disappointment and frustration toward me, the leadership of the state or the organization. You gave each of us, and me, the strength needed to keep a level head, ponder all the scenarios, and be prepared for whatever the outcome would be. Your support was and is greatly appreciated.

Let us now turn our attention back to the Sir Knights and ladies of Michigan. That we may have the wisdom and strength to make decisions that are necessary to make our commanderies stronger, implement programs which provide added value and ultimately leaving us with the mindset of being proud that we are Sir Knights and ladies of this Grand Commandery of Michigan.

If I may, pray for our brother, Michael B. Johnson, for the new leadership of the Grand Encampment that they may be guided by wisdom and the hand of God and for each of us that we may continue to be a beacon for what is morally good in this world.

Take care, safe travels to wherever the journey takes you and remember, especially after this experience, Together, for a Better Tomorrow!
