If you wanted to see your loved one on the Nursing side, you just cannot walk over there. No physical contact. Most of them get by using phone calls, video chats and letters. If you know of anyone that is in lock down or quarantined give them a call, send them a care package, or drop by the window and say "Hi"! It makes a big difference.

I just watched the Dragon Crew take off from Florida into space to hook up with the International Space Station! What a wonderful site! Some good news for us too! Stay safe and catch you next month.

May 20, 2020 To: All members of all constituent Masonic Lodges in Michigan **EDICT 2020-6**

Greetings,

This edict will inform you about recent developments in Michigan as they pertain to the activities of our Lodges and my Edicts, 2020-1 through 2020-5.

At this juncture, the Governor appears to be moving toward allowing an opening up of social gatherings on a regional basis. Social gatherings are defined as 10 or fewer, which would include most of our Lodges.

It is my decision that when groups of ten (10) persons are allowed to gather in those areas within the State of Michigan geographic regions, Masonic lodge gatherings, meetings, and communications may occur in compliance with State Law. As I write this edict, the areas that the Governor has opened up to gatherings of ten or less are the entire Upper Peninsula (Region 8) and a portion of the northern part of the lower peninsula (Region 6). The lodges in these areas are the only lodges that I am releasing from the restrictions set forth in the above-noted Edicts. As more areas are released by the State of Michigan, I will issue new guidance to those Lodges in the affected areas. I expect Lodge leadership and individual members to act with a common sense regarding their attendance. If a Brother is compromised in terms of age or health, I would encourage them to stay home. Further, all requirements for masks, washing of hands, and social distancing must be maintained.

I will monitor future developments as they occur. If you have any opinions or feedback, please feel free to contact me.
