Before the Mark Master Degree

Brother, when you first knocked at the door of Freemasonry at your Lodge, you sought admission into the York Rite of Freemasonry. In a Masonic sense, a Rite has been defined as a collection of degrees which are, and for a considerable time have been, customarily considered as a group or unit, either because of having a common government or being associated with a succession or schedule of work. The York Rite consists of four bodies: Lodge, which is Symbolic, Chapter, which is Capitular; council, which is Cryptic; and Commandry, which is Chivalric. All the degrees and orders of the York Rite illustrate some great lesson of Freemasonry and its philosophy.

For well over 150 years, the term York Rite has been known to Freemasons throughout the world. You may start with the Entered Apprentice Degree and go through the Order of the Temple, the last degree, and always find the golden thread in connection with and in relation to the Symbolic Degrees. Chapter, Council, and Commandry Degrees are in addition to, but in no way higher than, Symbolic Degrees. All Masonic Bodies acknowledge that there is no higher degree than that of Master Mason.

You have petitioned a Chapter and been elected to receive the Capitular degrees. I congratulate you on being found worthy and will answer any questions you may have about the four degrees conferred in our Chapter. In the Entered Apprentice Degree, you began your labors before an unfinished Temple, the great edifice being erected by King Solomon, to be the abiding place of the Highest God. When you were passed to the degree of Fellowcraft you still labored before that unfinished Temple. When you were raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason you approached but did not achieve, the completion of the Temple. Therefore, you finished the Symbolic Degrees with the Temple unfinished and the great truth of Freemasonry not yet revealed to you, only a substitute.

You are now about to be advanced to the degree of Mark Master. You will find yourself to be still a workman laboring on the unfinished Temple. You will not be hoodwinked, and you will see how the working tools are put to use. You will be instructed in Masonic ethics.

As you participate in the Mark Master Degree, remember that the Keystone which you will be carrying symbolizes wisdom, strength, and beauty and represents your life and how you live it. To successfully build our spiritual temple, we must comply with the rules of moral and Masonic conduct. We must be particularly careful not to reject the work of others through ignorance or claim credit for the work of others.

You will be instructed to select a Mark and also in the use of that Mark. You will find that the Mark which we choose is the character of our thoughts, words, and deeds. As our Marks become identified with our name and make up our character. This is not only seen by our fellow men, but by that All Seeing Eye unto whom all hearts are open, all desire is known, and from whom no secrets are ever hidden.

In this degree we are also reminded of our obligation to our less informed Brethren, to answer the pledge of a Brother in need, and that money may be merely the symbol of other and often greater needs, such as sympathetic understanding, goodwill, and friendship.

As you pass through this Mark Master Degree, may the lessons portrayed have a deep and lasting effect upon your future life and conduct.

The Four Degrees of Royal Arch Masonry By J. Fairbain Smith, PGHP

Mark Master

This is the first of four degrees in Chapter, and in it, the candidate is still symbolically laboring on an unfinished temple, he is taught the nobility of labor and that in the erection of his moral and spiritual temple, he must determine and prepare the materials of which that temple is to be constructed, and to have due care that in doing the work he must present, bearing his mark, shall be such as to designate him as one worthy of admission to "that house not made by hands, eternal in the heavens.".

Past Master

Originally the Royal Arch Degrees could not be conferred upon a Brother who had not previously presided over a Lodge. Eventually, it was conferred upon all candidates for the Royal Arch Degree. The brother receiving it in that manner is a Virtual, not an Actual, Past Master. It teaches that he who would rule others must first learn to rule himself.

Most Excellent Master

This degree recites the events surrounding the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple. Here the mason sees for the first time completed the construction of the temple on which he has symbolically labored in all previous degrees. Symbolically it represents the building of life and character and the reward which come of him faithfully performs this task.

Royal Arch Mason

Except for the Master's Degree, no Masonic Degree is more important in its historical and symbolic significance than this. In some form, it appears in every Rite, but only here does its history, symbolism, its lessons show so vividly its connection with Master Mason Degree, and the fact is, indeed, the final chapter of that essential degree of Freemasonry. It brings to light that for what the mason has searched.






